FREE OF CHARGE



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Vision is one of the most important senses for a child's development. Vision has an impact on the development of their motricity and their global learning (language, reading, writing, etc.).

Around 80% of the information received by the brain comes from the eyes.

Your child cannot tell you that they cannot see properly, as they do not know any different.

When treatment is necessary, the earlier it is started, the more likely it is to be effective.



YES, BUT...

'My child doesn't talk yet; he's still too young to name the images.'

Yes, but...

it's not necessary to be able to talk in order to examine the eyes and check that they are parallel. The tests are adapted to the child's age.

'My child picks up all the crumbs!'

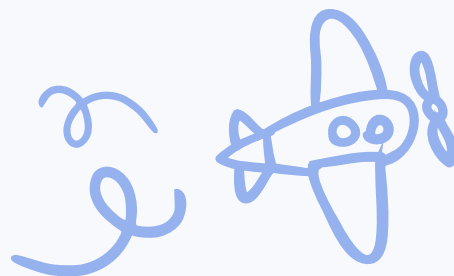
Yes, but...

one eye is enough to see them. It is important to check that your child is using both eyes. If one eye is not used, the vision in that eye will not develop normally.

'She sees all the planes in the sky!'

Yes, but...

seeing a plane does not mean recognising its shape. Only a vision test can determine whether or not a child needs glasses.



WATCH OUT FOR THE WARNING SIGNS

Do not wait for an invitation to an eye test; consult an ophthalmologist immediately if you notice:

- A white reflection in your child's eye, especially in photos
- A lack of response to visual stimulation
- If your child has red and watery eyes
- If your child squints, after the age of 4 months, whether constantly or occasionally
